Why do I need a data management plan?

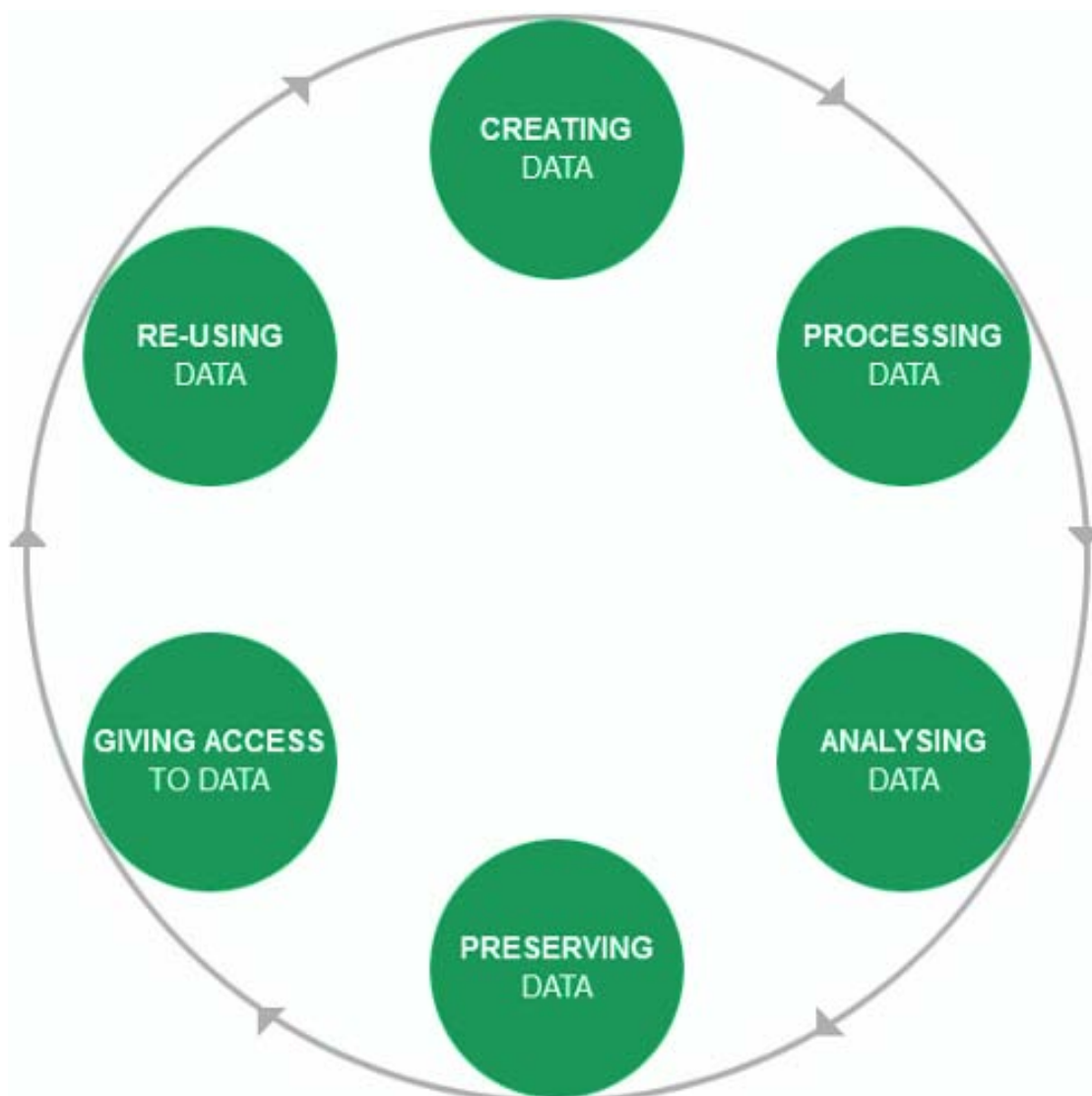
Data created from research are valuable resources.

They can be used and reused for future scientific and educational purposes.

Good data management practices are essential in research, to make sure that research data are of high quality, are well organised, documented, preserved and accessible and their validity controlled at all times.

This results in efficient and excellent research. Well managed data are easily shared and can thus be used for new research or to duplicate and validate existing research.

Data management needs to be planned early on in research, so that practices can be implemented throughout the research cycle.

If you are an ESRC award holder

As an ESRC award holder, you are expected to make the research data that result from your award available for secondary scientific research. This is specified in the ESRC Research data policy.
