# Why cite data?

- acknowledges the author's sources
- makes identifying data easier
- promotes the reproduction of research results
- makes it easier to find data
- allows the impact of data to be tracked
- provides a structure which recognises and can reward data creators

## What is a DOI?

## http://dx.doi.org/10.5255/UKDA-SN-7534-3

- an international standard for persistently identifying digital objects, or information about them, in a globally unique way
- a string of letters and numbers that can be used to make resources directly available to anyone over the internet
- is assigned to the data collection each time there is a major change to data, documentation or metadata

# Citation for survey microdata

- new Digital Object Identifier (DOI) is assigned to the data collection each time there is a major change to data or metadata
- new DOI will resolve to an updated version of the jump page
- jump page contains a log of changes to this data collection since the allocation of its first DOI

- DOIs are minted each time a new edition of an international dataset is published
- all DOIs for a particular dataset resolve to the same landing (jump) page
- multiple formats are not provided

# QualiBank

- QualiBank is the UK Data Service's search and browse interface for qualitative data objects
- allows searching of the content of text files, such as interviews, essays, open ended questions and reports
- allows searching of metadata attached to these objects, such as a description of an image or of an audio recording
- enables hyperlinking to related objects
- a citation can be made for a whole object or interview extracts


